What is Governance for Sustainable Development?

• Global SD governance is organized action by individuals and by organizations such as governments, intergovernmental bodies, the private sector, community and NGO bodies taken to achieve sustainable development objectives concerning problems of global interest [Hanson, IISD]




What is "networked governance"?

- The movement from vertical to horizontal governance... driven by growing citizen demands for more personalized and connected services, the plummeting costs of collaboration ..., the rise in outsourcing, and a new attitude towards networking." [Eggers, Deloitte-Touche 2007]
- Characterized by systems of communications, knowledge exchange, and dialogue
- Underpinned by the Internet
