

# SPEAKER BIOS



## **Dr. Vandana Shiva, India**

Director of the Research Foundation for Science, Technology and Ecology and Managing Trustee of Navdanya Trust with the mission to protect nature and people's rights to knowledge, biodiversity, water and food. Navdanya has grown into a national movement to protect the diversity and integrity of living resources, especially native seed, and to promote organic farming and fair trade.

Among other awards she received the 1993 Alternative Nobel Prize, the Order of the Golden Ark, the Global 500 Award of UN, and the Earth Day International Award.

Trained as a physicist, the focus of Dr. Shiva's work today is on intellectual property rights / biopiracy, biotechnology, organic farming, fair trade, genetic engineering, and gender issues.



## **Sir Mark Moody-Stuart, United Kingdom**

Chairman, Anglo American, plc;  
Board member of HSBC Holdings plc and Accenture Ltd,  
Chairman of the Foundation for UN Global Compact,

Former Chairman of the Committee of Managing Directors (1998 to 2001) of Royal Dutch / Shell, where he spent most of his career. He co-chaired the G8 task force on Renewable Energy.

His career has taken him to Spain, Oman, Brunei, Nigeria, Turkey, Malaysia, The Netherlands and UK. He was appointed by UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan as one of only 11 world business leaders on the United Nations Global Compact Board. He was knighted by Queen Elizabeth in 2000.



## **His Excellency Ambassador Raúl Estrada-Oyuela, Argentina**

Director of Environmental Affairs at Argentina's Foreign Ministry

A native of Buenos Aires, Ambassador Estrada-Oyuela served in Argentina's embassies in the United States, Austria, Brazil and Chile before he was asked to lead a U.N. effort to get 160 countries to jointly address the issue of global warming at meetings in Kyoto, Japan, in 1997. For his leadership role he has been widely recognized as a grandmaster of diplomacy and is considered the »godfather« of the Kyoto protocol.



## **Prof. Dr. Elinor Ostrom, USA**

Professor of Political Science Indiana University, Bloomington. Prof. Ostrom was elected a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in spring, 1991, and a member of the National Academy of Science in 2001.

Recent awards include the James Madison Award by the American Political Science Association (2005), the Sustainability Science Award from the Ecological Society of America (2005), and the Doctor of Humane Letters from the University of Michigan (2006). Prof. Ostrom's institutional approach to public policy was considered distinct enough to be thought of as a separate »school« of Public Choice Theory. She has published prolifically in the fields of organizational theory, political science, and public administration.

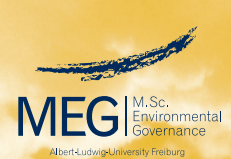

# 2007 Freiburg Forum on Environmental Governance

Students of the international M.Sc. Program Environmental Governance organize the Freiburg Forum on Environmental Governance as part of their training at the University of Freiburg. Each session of the annual Forum is dealing with a current, internationally relevant environmental governance issue integrating market, state and civil society coordination mechanisms to tackle existing and potential environmental crises. The general aim is to foster discussion and to plant the seeds of sustainable development and wise leadership in a new generation of global citizens, namely students, junior staff from NGOs, administrations, enterprises, but also senior personnel and the wider public.

## 2007 Forum topic:

### »The role of individual leadership in environmental governance«

Whereas the design and institutionalisation of environmental governance processes has received ample attention in recent years, the role of leadership, and particularly the role of individuals in shaping governance processes and directing their outcomes, has hardly been discussed yet. A first step towards the systematic understanding will be developed with personal interpretations of world renowned advocates from the fields of policy, business, civil society and science who will share their views on the meaning of individual leadership in the context of environmental governance.

A poster exhibit featuring outstanding examples of individual leadership from the students' 16 different home countries will properly frame the Forum.
