- no linear managerial approach, but MEGs as sensible intermediaries and facilitators for sustainable environments

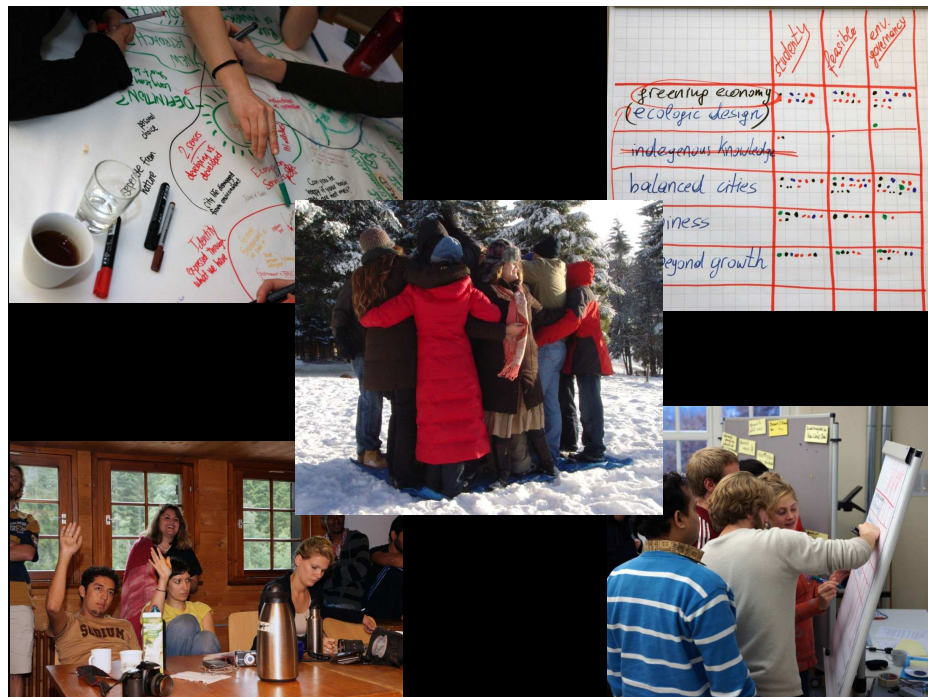
